After successfully invading Poland, Karl XII helped install Stanisław Leszczynski as king in 1705, replacing his nemesis Augustus II, the Strong. A faction, though, remained loyal to the Saxon elector Augustus, boon ally of Peter the Great against Sweden. The allies attempted to regain control in Poland-Lithuania, but they were thwarted, first by Karl XII at the Battle of Grodno, then by his commander, Carl Gustav Rehnskiöld at the Battle of Franstadt. With the Saxon electorate now virtually undefended, the Swedish king joined his forces with those of Rehnskiöld, who he promoted to Field marshal and Count, and they occupied Silesia. Augustus the Strong sued for peace. Under the Treaty of Altranstädt, Augustus had to renounce his claims to the Polish throne, while his alliance with Russia was declared void.

After Sweden's crushing defeat at Poltava, Karl fled with a small entourage into the Ottoman Empire. At Bendery, in Moldova, Karl set up camp with 1,000 Karoliner. The Turks welcomed Karl, and soon a small village named Karlstadt had to be built near Bendery to accommodate the burgeoning Swedish population. As a gesture of goodwill, Sultan Ahmet III bought some of the captured Swedish women and children out of Russian bondage and turned them over to Karl, helping to further swell the Swedish colony. Eventually, though, the Turks grew tired of Karl's scheming (he incited a war between Russia and the Ottoman Empire); while the local merchants grew irate over the debts he was piling up.

In January 1713, the townspeople attacked the Swedish settlement. The janissaries became involved and they captured Karl and placed him under house arrest, first in Dimetoka in Thrace, then Istanbul, where he whiled away the time playing chess and studying the Ottoman navy — his sketches would lead to the construction of two famous Swedish war ships, the Jarramas and the Jildirim. Karl succeeded in leaving his imprisonment in the fall of 1714 and made his way back to Pomerania on horseback.

In the fall of 1714, the alliance of Denmark, Norway, and Saxony, continued in its efforts to take Sweden's Pomeranian port of Stralsund. Russian forces under Prince Alexander Menshikov, along with a corps of Saxon engineers, had taken Sweden's second major Pomeranian fortress, Stettin, the year before. But by this time, Peter the Great, in compliance with the June 25, 1714 Treaty of Adrianople, had been required to withdraw his forces. Leaving his imprisonment in Turkey, Karl XII, meanwhile, in a mad dash, traversed Europe on horseback in some 15 days to arrive in Pomerania. Karl viewed Stralsund as a strategic base to launch renewed attacks on Peter the Great, and now he would personally lead its defense. He sought aid from Brandenburg-Prussia, but would not agree to Friedrich Wilhelm's demands on Stettin and the payment of 400,000 reichstalers. In April 1715, Brandenburg-Prussia declared war and joined the alliance. Near the end of 1715, the allies prevailed and forced the surrender of the city; Karl XII escaped to Sweden.

MEDALS OF THE CIRCLE / SOCIETY OF AMATEURS OF THE RUSSIAN MILITARY PAST

On 3 March 1946, through the initiative of P.V. Pashkov and A.A. Stakhovich, the Circle of Amateurs of the Russian Military Past was organized at Asnières near Paris. The initial roster was made up of twelve members living in or near Paris. By its heyday, the group numbered some 300 members from all the lands where émigrés had found refuge. The Circle was not only for militaria enthusiasts, but also for numismatists, postcard collectors, exlibrists and other related specialists. In 1952, the name was changed to the Society of Amateurs of the Russian Military Past; and in the 1960s to The Society of Those Who Cherish the Russian Military Past.

For many centuries, Chinese tea was pressed into bricks in order to survive the long trek from China to eager markets in Russia. Because of the high value attached to tea in Asia, the tea bricks, over time, came to form a simple currency in China, Tibet, Mongolia and Central Asia. The nomads in Siberia and Mongolia, in fact, preferred it to metallic coin-in Siberia, tea bricks were used as currency until the mid-1940's. Tea bricks were used as money, eaten as food in times of hunger and broken off and brewed as a medicine to treat coughs and colds. By the late 19th –early 20th Century, Russian companies began stamping tea bricks to be used as trade currency in their Asian endeavors, a practice which continued into the Soviet period. Their survival rate is quite low, and whole bricks are very rare and greatly prized.



Published in the Chemnitz-Zwickau area, Der Kämpfer (The Fighter') was originally a newspaper connected with the Independent Social Democratic Party of Germany (USPD). In January 1919, it became an organ of the German Communist Party. The KPD (Komunistische Partei Deutschland) was founded in the wake of World War I by socialists led by Rosa Luxemburg and the radical Spartacist League. Under the leadership of Karl Leibknecht and Luxemburg, the party was committed to violet revolution in Germany. A new leadership in 1923, though, set its eyes more on political action than immediate revolution and actively contested Reichstag elections. The KPD was banned and suppressed by the Nazis in 1933.
